6. Correspondence

A letter from Ahabbir Ahmed was read. He asked about the possibility of the IPE maintaining a library of technical books. After discussion with the members present, it was decided that it is not feasible at this time, since we have no space to house it. Also, a small library was instituted in the past, but it was not well utilized and, therefore, discontinued.

Also, a letter from the Alberta IPE was read. Alberta branch is in the process of obtaining a trademark for the professional certification mark PE. They have filed an application, but have been opposed by two professional groups. The legal process could be lengthy. Alberta has given us written permission to use this trademark.

7. Reports

a) Art Smith, Area Rep – 2005 Toronto AGM

- We are going to continue on with the new member's anniversary date effective from the month he/she becomes a member.
- New IPE brochures will be printed as soon as possible.
- The Vancouver Branch Logo Latin translation will be changed to conform to the IPE operational memo.
- The Calgary, Vancouver, Victoria business plan will be completed by April 2006. This resolution for a detailed break down on how the budget is spent. To date, operations memo GM 15 --Jan. 05 was created. A draft of all budget forms is completed and it is estimated 95% of the business plan is completed.
- A resolution was passed to decrease the early payment discount from \$10.00 to \$5.00 for one year only.

- A resolution was passed to increase the dues by \$5.00. (if a member wants save \$10.00 I suggest you pay for 2006 dues as soon as possible, before the invoice come out)
- A resolution was passed to pay the National Secretary \$2.00 per day.
- A resolution was passed to pay the National Office Manager \$18,000 per year.
- Lorne Shewfelt, area director for Alberta has revised 75 80% of the operational memos and forms.
- The third national newsletter is now on the National Website <u>www.NIPE.ca</u>
- National has retained Casey Kok as the National Webmaster for 2006.
- Approval was given to the office manager to purchase a new photocopier.
- The professional engineers in Alberta are still opposing the Edmonton branch that are in the process of trade marking the PE for National. The IPE lawyers feel confident that the final conclusion will be in our favor.
